

BRIEFLY LEGAL AND COMMISSION NOTE Cameras in the House and Preserving License Fees

TODAY'S QUESTION

Can the listing agent or seller have cameras in a house that record movement and/or conversations between the buyer and the buyer's agent?

THE ANSWER

All potential buyers and their agents should assume there are cameras on any property you are viewing and act and speak accordingly. Many people have cameras as this has become commonplace for protection of property. If you are viewing a listing with a potential buyer, be aware that your every movement and conversation may be recorded. So that you do not give up negotiating power, you should instruct potential buyers to look at the property but save comments and questions for later follow up conversation.

COMMISSION NOTE-License Fees are Safe for Now

This is about as close as you can come to the end of the month. We have been waiting for the General Fund Budget to pass and head to the Governor's desk. After passing both the House and Senate, it moved on to conference committee to work out the House and Senate differences.
